CSA and ASPPPO Annual Joint Meetings

Held at the Providence Presbyterian Church on Cordillo Parkway at 3PM on Thursday, May 13, 2010.

ASPPPO

ASPPPO President Don Carlson called the meeting to order and conducted items of routine business. He thanked past and current board members and the ASPPPO staff and then moved to update the ASPPPO members on the activities of the Board.

President Carlson began by explaining that ASPPPO was created in the early 70's to work with the Sea Pines Company as the voice of residential property owners and since then has remained a consistent advocate for residents. He discussed ASPPPO's preliminary discussions with The Resort about various covenant issues and about The Resort's impending redevelopment plans stressing that these are very preliminary discussions. He promised transparency as talks become more specific.

On behalf of residential property owners, President Carlson asked the boards and all property owners to creatively meet the challenges presented by a tough economic and housing climate. He also expressed the need for Sea Pines to address problems such as aging housing and infrastructure. He encouraged residents to patronize Sea Pines restaurants and shops.

CSA

President John McLauchlin called the CSA Annual Meeting to order and conducted several routine items of business.

He introduced CSA Executive Vice President Cary Kelley to give an operations overview. Mr. Kelley discussed accelerated road projects, improved communications efforts, the status of Sea Pines dredging, the Forest Preserve Foundation and the Six Oaks Cemetery. He also noted that CSA Security has reported the lowest crime rate in 20 years. In particular, three officers were recognized whose good judgment and professionalism brought a potentially explosive domestic situation involving gun shots to a peaceful conclusion.

President McLauchlin praised the CSA staff and thanked them for the excellent work they do. He recognized CSA board members and committee chairs, who were asked to introduce their volunteer members.

President McLauchlin recommended the 2009 Annual Report to all members for CSA Board actions during 2009 and early 2010. He then highlighted several key activities currently underway, e.g., revision and restatement of our Gate Policy, Rules and Regulations and Bylaws; dredging our waterways; and an integrated Strategic Plan for our Sea Pines community. The floor was then opened to audience Q&A.

Enjoy a leisurely stroll in casually elegant Harbour Town this summer and check out the open air vendors demonstrating their crafts with a local flair. No need to travel to Italy; Harbour Town offers the ambience of the Mediterranean right in Sea Pines.

South Beach: A New England Style Harbor Village

At the southern tip of the island, family friendly **South Beach Marina Village** offers water sports, a lovely stretch of beach and magnificent sunsets, not to mention a variety of shops and restaurants, including the famous Salty Dog Café and outside bar. You will find live entertainment nightly as well as kid-friendly activities. Salty Dog tee shirts, originally reserved for employees, can be seen all over the country today, maybe the world!

17 Miles Of Fabulous Bike Trails

Sea Pines Plantation has 17 miles of bike trails and five miles of sandy beach on which to bike and explore! Throw a leg over your beach cruiser, and you can bike to breakfast or lunch at one of the many restaurants within Sea Pines. On the way you can count the different wildlife you see. Great Blue Herons are often found fishing in a lagoon while the native American alligator naps nearby in the sun on the bank. You might see the large black Anhinga holding its wings out to dry. If your bike hike takes you past Lawton Stables, you may be able to see Harley the Clydesdale or some Wood Storks having a meeting.

South Beach Marina Village and Harbour Town are ideal biking destinations for the whole family. The bike trails will also take you through the Forest Preserve and past the historic Stoney Baynard Ruins. But maybe the best ride of all is to meander aimlessly through the natural Sea Pines environment. You may lose your way but not your sense of adventure. And don't worry—there are plenty of maps along the way.

5 MILES OF PRISTINE BEACHES

The wide, smooth Sea Pines beach with its shallow, sloping undersea floor make this paradise for small children. The beach beckons the whole family to relax and read; indulge your creative side by building a sand castle; or get a little exercise by flying an old-fashioned kite or walking or jogging in the surf.

Biking the beach is also a popular pastime. Be sure to check the wind and tide though (find a link on our website, <u>seapinesliving.com</u>). At low tide the beach goes on forever, and with the wind at your back you might not even need to peddle. Riding into the wind is like riding uphill at best; at worst, it can sometimes make the sand on the beach appear as though the "dementors" of Harry Potter fame have swooped in!



Sea Pines offers beach access paths every tenth of a mile for residents and guests who choose to walk or bike to the beach. Limited parking is available at **The Sea Pines Beach Club** (785-3494), which also offers restrooms and many amenities such as charming outdoor dining facilities, entertainment for children and adults and beach rentals. The **Sea Pines Trolley** makes regular runs to the Beach Club. For Sea Pines residents only, **Tower Beach Club** also offers parking, restrooms, outdoor grills and a pavilion.

3 CHALLENGING PUBLIC GOLF COURSES

Since 1969, when Arnold Palmer won the first Heritage Golf Tournament at the Harbour Town Golf links, Sea Pines and Hilton Head Island have been known for their world class golf facilities. Within Sea Pines, three extraordinary courses are available to residents and visitors. Golf reservations, 842-8484.

- The **Ocean Course** was the very first golf course built on Hilton Head in 1962. It challenges golfers of all skill levels with its strategically placed lagoons and bunkers.
- **Heron Point** received a multi-million dollar redesign in 2008 by the legendary golf course architect Pete Dye and features reshaped fairways with dramatic angles and shifting elevations.
- Home of the PGA Heritage, the most famous and some say the most challenging Sea Pines course, **Harbour Town Golf Links**, is consistently named as one of the top resort golf courses in the country by Golf Digest and Golf Weekly magazines. Harbour Town places a premium on imagination and shot making with its narrow fairways, small greens and one of the most recognizable 18th holes anywhere with the Harbor Town lighthouse.

GRAB A GAME OF TENNIS

The Sea Pines company established the first tennis program on Hilton Head Island in 1959, and tennis has been an essential element in the Sea Pines recreational mix ever since. One of the country's premier tennis destinations, Sea Pines offers world-class choices:

- The **Sea Pines Resort Racquet Club at Harbour Town**, under the direction of former U.S. Open and Wimbleton champion Stan Smith, offers a variety of programs for different ages and skill levels; 23 Har-tru clay courts, 4 hard courts, 5 lighted courts. 363-4495


